Awarding of the Request for Proposal RFP 2024-0016 – Fire and Life Safety

Services Maintenance and Monitoring

RECOMMENDATION

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Request for Proposal, RFP 2024-0016 – Fire and Life Safety Services Maintenance and Monitoring be awarded to Troy Fire & Life Safety.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Request for Proposal (RFP) was released on October 10, 2024, and closed on October 24, 2024. It was issued for the provision of Fire & Life Safety Systems Services Maintenance and Monitoring Services for all properties of the Sault Ste Marie Housing Corporation, with a contract term of five (5) years.

SUMMARY/OVERVIEW

The scope of work for RFP 2024-0014 includes providing all labor, materials, equipment, and transportation necessary to provide services for various sites in Sault Ste. Marie. The respondents submitted costs for Services, Maintenance and Monitoring for fire and life systems.

There were two proposals submitted for this RFP: Troy Life and Fire Safety, and Safe and Sound. The tables below break down the cost of each proposal.

In the first year of the contract, Troy Life and Fire Safety's cost is \$5,942 lower than that of Safe and Sound. In years 2-5, Troy Life and Fire Safety's cost exceeds Safe and Sound's by \$707.85 per year. Over the five- year term, Troy Life and Fire Safety's total cost is \$3,110.75 lower than safe and sound's, based on the estimated annual hours from previous years.

There are no financial implications for the 2024 Operations Budget. The estimated cost over five years for this contract is \$583,926.

2025 SSMHC Budget

RECOMMENDATION

Be it resolved that the Sault Ste. Marie Housing Corporation (SSMHC) Board approve the 2025 Budget as presented.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The 2025 SSMHC Budget considers many of the recent property acquisitions. After operating these properties for some time, we are now more accurately able to budget for these properties, which is reflected in this budget. Additionally, this budget includes the cost increases we continue to see with move-out repairs, building security, and insurance.

SUMMARY/OVERVIEW

Management has reviewed all budget lines in depth when preparing this budget. This has resulted in many budget lines remaining in line with the prior year. Along with operational increases in move-out repairs, building security and insurance, this budget includes new mortgages and capital reserve contributions for newly acquired properties ensuring we can financially support any future capital costs for these properties.

Additionally, management was able to reduce the utilities budget even while adding additional units. This was achieved through the Board's investment in energy efficiency measures such as the Demtroy Units at 49 St. Mary's, heat pumps in the Shannon/Capp neighbourhood, lighting upgrades, furnace replacements and new windows and doors. These investments will ensure that SSMHC properties remain sustainable for many years.

For the 2025 Budget, the Housing portion of the DSSMSSAB Subsidy is included in Revenue, which is a direct transfer from the District of Sault Ste. Marie Social Services Administration Board (DSSMSSAB). In years past, this portion was included in the overall DSSMSSAB Subsidy, but in 2025 the Operating and Housing portions are separated. Overall, the combination of both reflects a \$228,390 increase over 2024. There is no change to what was presented at the October 17th Board Meeting.

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STRATEGIC PLAN IMPACT

The 2025 Budget will continue to support the DSSMSSAB's strategic plan going forward, including sustained Service Delivery, Organizational Structure, and strengthening strategic Community Partnerships.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

DSSMSSAB will fund, via a direct transfer, the amount of \$3,394,800, to support the 2025 SSMHC Budget.

CONCLUSION

This budget, inclusive of all properties acquired in recent years, will ensure the SSMHC has the financial ability to support not only the day-to-day requirements of the operations, but also the capital needs required to continue to provide affordable housing in the Sault Ste. Marie District.
